We will be continuing in-person talks this semester and all the talks will be at 12:00 PM in the Virginia Room.

## **Blackwell Talks are Works in Progress**

Are you completing a dissertation? Have you recently completed one? Are you preparing for a conference? Submitting for a publication? Do you have research that has been left on the back-burner for too long and wish to breathe new life into it? Blackwell Talks are designed to showcase and support budding scholarship at its early stages.

Submissions are open to all faculty and staff and we look forward to considering your proposal for one of the Blackwell Scholar speaker slots.

Blackwell Scholars will receive a \$150 stipend and a certificate.

## **Proposals must include:**

- 1. Exact title of your presentation
- 2. Presenter name(s) with a short biography
- 3. Presenter department(s)
- 4. Presenter email address & phone
- 5. Semester and Year of most recent Blackwell Talk for each presenter, if applicable
- 6. *Project Description:* Include a description of the subject of your presentation written for a general audience (250 word maximum).
- 7. Description of Project Status: Include a description of the current state of the project and how this project represents a work in progress that will benefit through feedback from talk attendees. You could include questions or concerns that you have about moving forward with your research project (250 words maximum).

Presentations should plan to last no more than about 30 minutes, with the remaining time for discussion with the audience.

Presenters may use slides for the talk but it is not required.

The audience for the Blackwell Talks will consist of your fellow scholars and colleagues from various academic areas, and the atmosphere is kept purposefully relaxed.

We encourage presenters to attend all sessions in support of their fellow Scholars.
