The debate over whether or not abortion should be a legal option continues to divide Americans long after the US Supreme Court's 7-2 decision on Roe v. Wade declared the procedure a "fundamental right" on Jan. 22, 1973.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

PROS

- The US Supreme Court has declared abortion to be a "fundamental right" guaranteed by the US Constitution.
- Reproductive choice empowers women by giving them control over their own bodies.
- Personhood begins after a fetus becomes "viable" or after birth, not at conception.
- Fetuses are incapable of feeling pain when most abortions are performed.
- Access to legal, professionallyperformed abortions reduces maternal injury and death caused by unsafe, illegal abortions.

CONS

- Abortion is murder.
- Life begins at conception, so unborn babies are human beings with a right to life.
- Fetuses feel pain during the abortion procedure.
- Abortions reduce the number of adoptable babies.
- Abortion promotes a culture in which human life is disposable
- Abortion eliminates the potential societal contributions of a future human being.
- Selective abortion based on genetic abnormalities (eugenic termination) is overt discrimination.
