T-test for involvement by Educational Attainment

The dependent variable for this T-test is family engagement, and the independent variable is Educational Attainment among the parents. For family engagement we asked the families in a survey to rank their engagement in the activities we provided on a scale of 1-10. For the independent we asked parents “what is the highest degree of education you have completed?” They were provided with seven answer choices to choose from including “some high school”, “High school diploma or GED”, “certification from a trade or vocational school”, “some college”, “Associate’s degree”, “Bachelor’s degree”, and “Graduate degree or more”. For the purpose of this T-test I grouped some “high school”, “high school diploma or GED”, and “certification from a trade or vocational school” into the first group of “no college”. For the second group labeled “college” I compiled “some college”, “Associate’s degree”, “Bachelor’s degree”, and “Graduate degree or more together”. The results from the T-test indicate that there is no significance between family engagement and educational attainment.
