The best practices in making a perfect survey for research include the following: making the questions you're asking clear, avoiding asking two questions in one sentence, must be competent to answer and must be willing to answer. When asking these questions, they should be relevant to the research, avoid negative connotations, and avoid being biased. If all these are taken into consideration the survey research questions will be perfect. My main research question overall is how family fun time activities affect family involvement. The survey question I chose to operationalize my dependent variable is family involvement. "How involved was your family throughout the activity?" The survey question that I chose to operationalize my independent variable is social class. "What is your annual household income?" Primarily, I am interested in how social class affects family involvement. These are well-written questions because they are straightforward and not confusing. These are questions that parents can answer without any hesitation.
