
Quantitative Findings

The following variables were analyzed using descriptive statistics: Hours worked weekly by parents and parental involvement with their child. For hours worked by parents 1 respondent selected 0-10 hours, 1 respondent selected 21-30 hours, 7 respondents selected 31-40 hours, and 2 respondents selected 41-50 hours. The Findings can be seen in figure 1.

The dependent variable is parent involvement measured on a scale from 0 to 10. The mean parent involvement score was 7.73. The median score was 8, the mode was 10 and the standard deviation was 2. Table 1 shows the findings.

A bivariate shows the mean of parental involvement and the hours worked by the child's parent(s).
